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Profile

Mark Samuel knows about British architectural history, with special expertise in the medieval period. He worked for twenty years as an archaeologist and latterly as a post-excavation specialist; writing and illustrating publications for the Museum of London Archaeology Service (MoLA). He also worked for two years as a part-time lecturer (Continuing Education Department) at City University. He has worked as an independent researcher and post-excavation specialist since 2001.

His offer combines art historical knowledge with rigorous archaeological methodology and recording. This involves *Map Regression*, integrated with documentary analysis (topographic and written) and the interpretation of excavated evidence in digital media. This “skill set” is rare.

He has published extensively on the subject of medieval architecture and its role in monasticism. Irish medieval castles formed the basis of his PhD thesis; knowledge redeployed in a widely-acclaimed work on Blarney Castle (CUP) that he wrote with his late wife. In January 2008 he was elected to the Society of Antiquaries. More recently, he has worked extensively in Cambridge as a Finds consultant for the main archaeological units involved in Developer-funded archaeology in the City. He is currently lecturing and publishing topics that have emerged as a result of his paid work. He is currently in the early stages of preparing a course on buildings archaeology for a major heritage consultancy.

Employment History

Currently (2001 to date)

Architectural Archaeology is an “independent” capable of discharging planning conditions for developers; this involves *standing structure* recording, analysis and research. An all-in package allowing comprehension of “stone moulding” assemblages is, in contrast, aimed squarely at the archaeological community. Notable recent projects include St Augustine’s Abbey (Canterbury Archaeological Trust) and the lost Cluniac Priory of Barnwell at Cambridge (Oxford Archaeology East).

Both activities involve much topographical research, involving the interpretation of antiquarian records of vanished structures and landscapes. More recently, *Heritage Interpretation* and *Conflict Archaeology* have been new foci of attention.

Past clients include the Museum of London, PCA, Wessex, Oxford Archaeology East, Canterbury Archaeology Trust, Cambridge Archaeology Unit. Various bodies charged with the curating of important buildings: Historic England (Windsor), St Paul’s Cathedral, Stowe School, the National Trust and many others have used his capacities since 2001.

Project Designs for recently-excavated and historic lapidary collections have been prepared for several museums. On the basis of such work, museum displays and publications have been completed for Merton Abbey (Museum of London) and Selborne Abbey (Hampshire).



More recently he has contributed to projects involving medieval and ecclesiastical architecture. These have allowed me to wear a new “heritage interpretation” hat. Selborne Priory excavations (Hampshire) and a thematic publications dealing with London’s medieval friaries have involved this “creative” work. A recent (2014) book of international significance dealt with the archaeology of pre-fire St Paul’s (English Heritage). This publication allowed a reconstruction of the long-lost eastern *Rose Window*.

In contrast, the work carried out for developers and their clients involves coping with a wide range of more typical buildings, including farming and industrial buildings; as well as WW2 defensive architecture.

As part of his CPD, he completed a course given by EH (2015) at Leicester University on the creating of *Statements of Significance*.

Ground-breaking activities include geographical research of WW2 anti-invasion defences at Pegwell Bay (Thanet District Council) and the recording and analysis of fabric revealed during conversion work at Stowe School. This intervention may cast light on Vanbrugh's design of this "villa complex". A publication is planned in consultation with a major expert on the subject.

In 2014, a detailed *Statement of Heritage Significance* was carried out for *Ramboll*. This involved Bower House - a Grade 2* listed house in Havering and one of the first works of Flitcroft.

An archaeological and documentary study of Smeaton and Rennie's dry dock in Ramsgate was carried out for *waterfrontsnl.com* (Yacht Valley Project). A paper will be given on this subject by the author at the Conference of Construction History (2018) at Queen's College, Cambridge).

Mark's work has also involved:

- Problem-solving on sites, adapting methodologies to arrive at the most appropriate to the circumstance.
- Naturalistic reconstruction illustrations of monastic buildings based on CAD underlay.
- Reconstructing systems of historic defence systems (WW2) through field recording, Google Earth and map-regression.

A rolling programme of reports about excavated stone mouldings has also been carried out. Most of this has been for units operating in Cambridge, but a major publication of archaeological excavations at Spitalfield, London, will see the light this year (2018). This includes complete reconstruction of complex traceried windows not seen since the Dissolution of St Mary Spital.

Public outreach in Kent has included Kent County Council (Randall Manor) and Thanet Archaeology Group (Pegwell Bay Defences).

He has also co-authored recent publications of excavations of Winchester Palace and Bermondsey Abbey (Southwark) for his previous employer. He is currently writing a popular book about the Claudian invasion of Britain (now drawing to completion) in his spare time.

Mark volunteered for three seasons at the Ramsgate Art Festival (*Summer Squall*) and is a tenor in a church choir (St Stephen's, Canterbury).

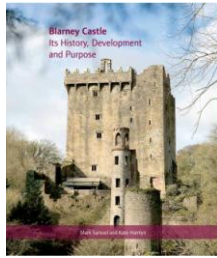
